ESTABLISHED July 2014

The Mission of Rice County Treatment Court is to reduce the adverse impact of serious and repeat offenders on the citizens and criminal justice system of Rice County, and create a system that is more effective for participants.

ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

- ❖ **Felony Offense (s) motivated by Substance Use Disorder**
- ❖ **High Risk/ High Need Offender**
- ❖ **Rice County Resident**

RCTC MODEL

- ❖ **Post Plea/ Condition of Probation**
- ❖ **Substance Use Disorder Treatment Required**
- ❖ **Three Phases of Structured Services and Accountability**

RCTC Hearings are scheduled every Thursday, 1:00 at Rice County Court House.

The RCTC Team meets weekly prior to the Hearing to review participant admission and progress.

RCTC Staff assist participants plan their weekly schedule and make referrals for community based services including: mental health services, employment and education services, parent education, and housing support.

RCTC COMPONENTS

The RCTC Team includes Treatment Providers for the integration of services into the RCTC Phases and a continuum of rehabilitative services.

Prosecution and Defense work together to promote public safety and protect a participant's due process rights.

Participants have frequent contact with the RCTC Judge throughout their participation; weekly in Phase One.

Participant progress is reviewed weekly by the RCTC Team. Incentives and Sanctions are recommended for the Hearing.

Abstinence is monitored by frequent Chemical Testing.

Participants are monitored in the community by Law Enforcement and RCCC Staff.
