Our Fulltime Deputy staff continued to monitor any snowmobile activity and investigate the complaints received during their normal patrol shifts. There was no DNR Conservation Officer assigned to our area during this time period so we were unable to work in conjunction with them.



Rice County hosted two POST accredited Snowmobile Laws & Regulations for Law Enforcement classes and co-hosted one additional class with another County. Thirt Thirteen law enforcement officers were in attendance from within Rice County agencies. Rice County also hosted several educational displays and booths at different area events, such as: YMCA's Healthy Kids DAY, Safety Camp, Nite to Unite, and also for six days at the Rice County Fair.

Rice County utilized 8 members of our Fulltime licensed Deputy Staff and three Deputies from our part-time staff to participate in snowmobile enforcement patrol shifts. Many of the shifts were in conjunction with our local DNR Conservation Officer. All of the Deputies that participated in enforcement patrol shifts also attended the POST accredited snowmobile laws & regulations classes that we hosted. Our Fulltime patrol Deputies also continue to monitor and enforce snowmobile activity during their regular patrol shifts.



We also had educational displays and booths at many area events, such as: YMCA's Healthy Kids Day, Walmart's Kids Day, Safety Camp, Nite to Unite and also at the Rice County Fair (6 days).

Rice County utilized 10 members of our FT Deputy staff and 2 Deputies from our PT staff, to participate in snowmobile enforcement patrol shifts. Many of our shifts included several hours of riding along with our local DNR Conservation Officer during enforcement activity. 15 of our Deputies attended the POST accredited snowmobile laws & regs classes that we had hosted. Our FT Patrol Deputies also continue to monitor snowmobile activity during their regular patrol shifts.


