

2020 GENERAL NOXIOUS WEED NOTICE

Notice is hereby given this 10th day of April 2020, pursuant to Minnesota Statutes, section 18.83 subp. 1, that all persons in Rice County, Minnesota, shall control or eradicate all noxious weeds on land they own, occupy or are required to maintain. Control or eradication may be accomplished by any lawful method but the method(s) applied may need to be repeated in order to prevent the spread of viable noxious weed seeds and other propagation parts to other lands. Failure to comply with the general notice may mean that an individual notice will be issued. An individual notice may be appealed within two working days of receipt to the appeal committee in the county where the land is located. Failure to comply with the individual notice will mean that the inspector having jurisdiction may either hire the work done or seek a misdemeanor charge against the person(s) who failed to comply. If the work is hired done by the inspector, the cost can be placed as a tax upon the land and collected as other real estate taxes are collected. Local weed inspectors are township supervisors, city mayors or their appointed assistants.

The statewide noxious weed listings are as follows:

- **Prohibited Eradicate List:** Prohibited noxious weeds that are listed to be eradicated are plants that are not currently known to be present in Minnesota or are not widely established. These species must be eradicated, meaning all of the above and below ground parts of the plant must be destroyed, as required by Minnesota Statutes, Section 18.78. Additionally, no transportation, propagation, or sale of these plants is allowed. Measures must also be taken to prevent and exclude these species from being introduced into Minnesota

The Eradicate list consists of Diffuse Knapweed, Yellow Star Thistle, Grecian Foxglove, Oriental Bittersweet, Japanese Hops, Dalmatian Toadflax, Common Teasel, Cut-leaved Teasel, Giant Hogweed, Brown Knapweed, Meadow Knapweed, Black Swallow-Wort, Palmer Amaranth, Tree of Heaven, Japanese Honeysuckle and Poison Hemlock.

- **Prohibited Controlled List:** Prohibited noxious weeds listed to be controlled are plants established throughout Minnesota or regions of the state. Species on this list must be controlled, meaning efforts must be made to destroy all propagating parts and prevent seed maturation and dispersal, thereby reducing established populations and preventing reproduction and spread as required by Minnesota Statutes, Section 18.78. Additionally, transportation, propagation, or sale of these plants is prohibited.

The Controlled list consists of Bohemian Knotweed, Giant Knotweed, Japanese Knotweed, Purple Loosestrife, Spotted Knapweed, Leafy Spurge, Wild Parsnip (Except for non-wild cultivated varieties), Common Tansy, Canada Thistle, Plumeless Thistle, Narrowleaf Bittercress and Common Barberry.

- **Restricted List:** Restricted noxious weeds are plants that are widely distributed in Minnesota and are detrimental to human or animal health, the environment, public roads, crops, livestock or other property, but whose only feasible means of control is to prevent their spread by prohibiting the importation, sale, and transportation of their propagating parts in the state except as allowed by Minnesota Statutes, Section 18.82.

The Restricted list consists of European Alder, Siberian Peashrub, Common or European Buckthorn, Glossy Buckthorn, Multiflora Rose, Garlic Mustard, Non-Native Phragmites, Porcelain Berry, Crown Vetch, Wild Carrot, Amur Honeysuckle, Morrow's Honeysuckle, Bell's Honeysuckle, Tatarian Honeysuckle, Black Locust and the following Japanese Barberry Cultivars; 'Anderson' (Lustre Green™); 'Angel Wings'; 'Antares'; 'Bailgreen' (Jade Carousel®); 'Bailone' (Ruby Carousel®); 'Bailsel' (Golden Carousel® - *B. koreana* × *B. thunbergii* hybrid); 'Bailtwo' (Burgundy Carousel®); *B. thunbergii* var. *atropurpurea*; 'Crimson Velvet'; 'Erecta'; 'Gold Ring'; 'Inermis'; 'JN Redleaf' (Ruby Jewel™); 'JN Variegated' (Stardust™); 'Kelleris'; 'Kobold'; 'Marshall Upright'; 'Monomb' (Cherry Bomb™); 'Painter's Palette'; 'Pow Wow'; 'Red Rocket'; 'Rose Glow'; 'Silver Mile'; 'Sparkle'; 'Tara' (Emerald Carousel® - *B. koreana* × *B. thunbergii* hybrid); Wild Type (parent species – green barberry)

- **Specially Regulated List:** Specially regulated plants are plants that may be native species or have demonstrated economic value, but also have the potential to cause harm in non-controlled environments. Plants designated as specially regulated have been determined to pose ecological, economical, or human or animal health concerns. Plant specific management plans and or rules that define the use and management requirements for these plants have been developed by the Minnesota Department of Agriculture for each plant designated as specially regulated. Measures must also be taken to minimize the potential for harm caused by these plants.

The Specially Regulated list consists of Poison Ivy, Norway Maple, Winged Burning Bush, and Amur Maple.
