Put your passion in action, jump-start your career in Public Health

As we continue to experience the effects of the global pandemic, there has never been a more important time to support the health and wellness of our communities.

Rice County Public Health is looking to host one AmeriCorps member who will serve as a Public Health Project Coordinator. As part of Public Health Corps, you will help support community engagement, data collection and project coordination.

With great training, mentoring, and support from public health experts, it is a great way to make an impact while launching a career in public health.

Members serve 40 hours a week and can begin service in August, October or January. All positions serve through July 2023.

As part of Public Health Corps, Public Health Project Coordinators receive:

- A stipend of \$1,100 paid every 2 weeks
- \$25,300 total for 1,700 hours of service starting in August 2022
- Up to \$6,495 for tuition or student loans*
- Federal student loan forbearance and interest repayment
- Individual health insurance — Monthly premium 100% covered
- Child care assistance — Based on family size and income

*The Segal AmeriCorps Education Award can be used to pay tuition or repay qualified student loans. Individuals 55+ may gift their award to their child, grandchild, foster child or stepchild.
